Megan Epler Wood is the author of the 2017 book, [*Sustainable Tourism on a Finite Planet*](#) which addresses the cascading consequences of rapid tourism growth in the next 30 years. She is the Director of the [International Sustainable Tourism Initiative](#), Department of Environmental Health at the T.H. Chan School of Public Health at Harvard University where she leads an international applied research program on [SMART Destination planning](#) and [Tourism and Environmental Health in a Changing Climate](#). She is Managing Director of the new [Sustainable Tourism Asset Management Program](#) (STAMP) launched in April 2017 at the [Center for Sustainable Global Enterprise](#) in the SC Johnson College of Business at Cornell University. She is the Principal of [EplerWood International](#) which has raised millions of dollars of investment for sustainably designed ecotourism and community development projects in over 20 countries working with USAID, the World Bank, and Inter-American Development Bank. She was an NGO leader establishing ecotourism as a leading sustainable development tool from 1990-2002. Epler Wood won a Lifetime Achievement award from The International Ecotourism Society in 2013 for her significant work in this field.
