Megan Epler Wood is the author of the 2017 book, <u>Sustainable Tourism on a Finite Planet</u> which addresses the cascading consequences of rapid tourism growth in the next 30 years. She is the Director of the <u>International Sustainable Tourism Initiative</u> at the T.H. Chan School of Public Health at Harvard University where she leads an international applied research program on <u>SMART Destination planning</u> and <u>Tourism and Environmental Health in a Changing Climate</u>. She is Managing Director of the new <u>Sustainable Tourism Asset Management Program</u> (STAMP) launched in April 2017 at the <u>Center for Sustainable Global</u>

Enterprise in the SC Johnson College of Business at Cornell University. She is the Principal of EplerWood International which has raised millions of dollars of investment for sustainably designed ecotourism and community development projects in over 20 countries working with USAID, the World Bank, and Inter-American Development Bank. She was an NGO leader establishing ecotourism as a leading sustainable development tool from 1990-2002. Epler Wood won a Lifetime Achievement award from The International Ecotourism Society in 2013 for her significant work in this field.
